## **Arrows** out-gun Fremont Ross

GALION — Ashland's unselfish transitional basketball and
ability to force Fremont Ross to
the perimeter proved a winning
recipe in Friday's Division I sectional final.

The Arrows routed the Little
Giants 69-41 to earn their first
sectional championship since
2008, holding Ross (10-12) to 14of-48 shooting (29 percent) in a
game at Galion High School that
was never really close.

Ashland will play top-seeded
Mansfield Senior — a 59-56 winner over Mansfield Madison in
Friday's opener — back at Galion Thursday at 7 p.m.

"We knew coming in that
Ashland was playing the best of
anybody in our sectional," said
Ross coach Mark Gedeon,
whose Little Giants' team was
8-2 after 10 games, before going
2-10 down the stretch. "They
shoot the basketball extremely
well. Their kids really make a
commitment to being in transition and do a great job of playing
team basketball.

"Teve entheir head coach (Tim
Fralick) said they shot it really
well tonight, and they did."

Trey Smith registered a
game-high 18 points for the Arrows (12-11), adding seven assists and three steals.

"Trey Smith played an excellent game for us," Fralick said.
"Not only did he get points early
on, and force them to mistakes
defensively, he had multiple assists and probably at least five
more passes that led to assists,
just because he was able to attack the basket and collapse the
defense. He was a catalyst for us,"

After Jack Gedeon's 3-pointer brought Ross within 10-7 midway thru the first quarter, Ashland ended the half on a 24-7

land ended the half on a 24-7 spurt.

The Arrows shot 26-0f-49 from the field, including 7-0f-15 from beyond the arc. When they weren't scoring outside, they got 28 points inside the painted area.

Most of that was created by collapsing the Little Giants' defense and making the extra pass. But Ashland's ability to run and get in transition also

factored in.

"That's what we've been doing and we've been pretty effective doing it over the second half of the season," Fralick said. "We've rededicated ourselves to pushing and pressuring defensively."

Isaac White contributed 12 points, along with three steals. Brent Vipperman had 11 points to go with seven

boards and four steals.

Gedeon, one of four seniors playing his final game for the purple and white, led Ross with 12 points and eight rebounds. Seniors Jarvis Jones and Drew Solander each had seven points inside, while senior wing Grant McConnell had five points and contributed seven boards.

"Obviously, we didn't play well and we know we can play better than that," coach Gedeon said. "We got ourselves an opportunity to play for a sectional title and I think our kids were excited by that.

"But ultimately, it comes down to who plays better basketball and I don't think there was any question who

the better team tonight was."
