Ross Center Scores 38 Points To Top Old Record Of 34

Coming through with a 28 point barrage in the second half in addition to 10 points registered in the opening quarters, Gail Brauchla, who started at center Tuesday night for Ross, cracked the school's individual scoring record with a 38 point total against invading Bellevue. The visitors lost an 86-66 game to the Little Giants in a non-conference game.

Brauchla, a senior transfer to Ross from Angola, Ind., has been alternating between center and a forward post during the season. His big night helped the Ross quintet back into the win column as Coach Al Ziemke's crew posted its third win in 14 games.

Thus it is that a new individual scoring record is in the Ross archives, erasing the 34 points held by Larry Miller, who copped the total last year, Ziemke said.

Third Period Spurt

It was not until the third period that the Little Giants shook loose from Coach Ray Skinner's Bellevue forces for good. That was at the point when Lane Beeker's long shot, a one-handed push archer, sent Ross out front 40-39 for keeps.

With four minutes, five seconds remaining in the third period Ross held an eight point lead and was on the way.

In the opening half, however, the picture was less brilliant for Ross. The game had been tied exactly 10 times, with Bellevue pulling away with the count 35-35 to move into an eventual 39-35 halftime lead.

Beeker scored four goals in the first half, with three of them bringing Ross into a tie again with the Bellevue forces. His scoring in the first half clutches held Ross within reasonable distance of Bellevue when the invaders moved out front on occasions.

Ross Rebounds

Ross came back in the second half like a hot-shot team. The Little Giants scored 51 points in the second half, 28 of them by Brauchla; meanwhile, Bellevue was getting 27 points in the final half.

Bellevue dropped its seventh game in nine outings. The team punch was reduced earlier in the season when several of the veterans were dropped for disciplinary measures. Only one eligible spare was on the bench and he was put in service with 3:37 remaining in the last period when Jim Ruess went out on five fouls.

Little, But Sharp

Despite the small stature of Louis Whisler at guard, who had a good part of his number 34 tucked into his trunks and room to spare in the uniform he was seeking to fill, he made 10 points.

Jim Koechley and Gerald Smith divided scoring honors for Bellevue with 19 each. Smith's left hand push shots from out were excellent.

Three other Little Giants beside Brauchla hit the double figure scoring. They included Beeker with 16 and Fred Middleton, who got all his points in the first period, and Beebe Schneider, with 11 each.

Al Price hit for nine, completing the starting lineup for Ross. Only one point was scored by one of five subs who entered the game for Ross and that was Mark Walters gift shot in the final period.

Kenny Adams hit for 15 points in the opening reserve game to lead Ross to a 60-50 victory over Bellevue's junior varsity. It was the third win in 13 games for Ross and snapped a three game losing streak.

Jack Lee had 14 and Tom Sherman 11 to aid the Ross drive to victory. In the Bellevue lineup Jack Foos had 16 points as top scorer.

Ross trailed 25-21 at the half, but the intermission discussion carried on in the dressing room must have been the clincher for Ross returned in the third period, scoring 22 points and completely shutting out Bellevue with no, that's zero, points.
