Bailey leads CMU  
MOUNT PLEASANT — Former Fremont Ross track star Fallon Bailey

helped lead the Central Michigan University women's indoor track team to a third-place finish at the Mid-American Conference Championships on March 1. Central Michigan finished third with 75.66 points, while host Kent State took first with 88 points. Ball State was second with 84.33 points.

Bailey, a sophomore, was one of two individual MAC champions for the Chipewas. She took the top spot in the 60-meter dash with a time of 7.65 seconds. Team-

mate Jackie Bozin won the pentathlon with 3,810 points.

Bailey also took fourth in the long jump with a distance of 18 feet, 8 inches.

## Frontz runs record time

MILWAUKEE, Wis. — Fremont Ross graduate Lindsay Frontz turned in a personal best time in the 1,000-meter run at the Horizon League Indoor Track and Field Championships on March 2 at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.
