Ross, after spurting to a 14-9 lead with
1:52 remaining in the first quarter, fell behind 21-14 two minutes into the second period. Steve McAllister and Randy Norris

scored five points apiece for Ashland and the Arrows maintained a four to seven-point cushion the rest of the half, walking off the floor with a 35-29 halftime lead.

"We did not make any major adjustments at halftime," Ross coach Pat McGhee said, "other than we felt like we really had to increase our pressure on defense and force their guards to handle the ball.
"We caused some turnovers and chipped away at the lead with some defense and we rebounded the ball better in the second

we rebounded the ball better in the second half. Those were the two things we did better in the second half."

In the second quarter, Ashland took charge of the boards and the lead.

"We were standing around and waiting for the ball to come to us instead of going to the ball and snapping it off aggresively," McGhee said. "We did not snap too

many of them in the second quarter but we went back to doing that better in the third and fourth quarter."

Coupled with the poor rebounding was Ross could not hit a short shot.

"We missed 14 shots in the paint in the first half," McGhee pointed out. "It was not so much they were beating us as we
