GIANTS CAN'T STOP SPARTANS

Ross can't slow down Lima standout in defeat

TOLEDO - After Bowling Green State University commit Rion Thompson nailed five 3-pointers en route to 24 first-half points, Fremont Ross tried a variety of defenses to try to slow down the Lima Senior guard.

Little Giants' head coach Juan Vela said his team even went as far as box-and-1 and triangle-and-2 defenses on the senior. Thompson had just one bucket in the second half but it was came after a missed free throw by Lima as Ross attempted to mount a comeback late in the with 2:39 left

tempted to mount a comeback late in the fourth quarter.

Thompson finished with 30 points and the Little Giants had 10 second-half turnovers as the Spartans defeated Ross, 63-53, Tuesday in a Division I sectional semifinal at Start High School.

"We tried everything to stop Thompson," Vela said. "We tried to slow her down but she's a tough player. I thought DeRae James did a nice job defending her in the second half."

With the win, Lima improves to 14-8 overall while Ross finishes the season at 8-15.

Thompson grabbed a steal from Ross' hands after teammate Kierre James missed a pair of free throws. The score increased the Spartans' lead to 57-47

with 2.39 left.

"It was key for us to have a chance in the second to slow down Thompson," said Vela. "I thought we did a pretty good job of it but we did not hit many shots in the second half. You have to hit shots against a team like Lima Senior if you want to win."

Valerie Samson had the hot hand early for Ross, scoring eight points in the first quarter to give the Little Giants a 18-15 edge after eight minutes. Thompson, who had ten points in the first quarter herself, went toe-to-toe with Samson for the first minute of the second quarter.

Thompson hit a 3-pointer to open the quarter but Samson drilled one of her own on the other end. Thompson, not to be outdone, smacked her second in a row

to tie the game at 21. Samson missed on the other end and that led to a James

"Defending a team like Lima Senior is tough," Vela said.
