Hershey's Tiffin Columbian girls basketball team used a mobile 1-3-1 defense to shackle Ross and hand the Little Giants a 46-26 setback in the first round of the Division I sectional tournament Tuesday night.

"We started the first possession in the 1-3-1," Hershey said. "Then I wanted to go to what I wanted to play, the 2-3, but they had trouble with the 1-3-1 right away, so, hey, the 2-3 wasn't

working so we went back to the 1-3-1 and it probably was the difference in the ballgame."

"It was the same defense that Findlay used the other night," Ross Coach Sue Wolf said, "but we just did not move against it tonight."
