

KOHR, ALTHOFF WILL BE NEW HEAD COACHES

Verifies Rumor No New Men Will Be Im- ported For Next Year

Supt. U. E. Diener announced Friday afternoon, following a conference, that the Ross high football coaching staff had been selected for the coming season while tentative arrangements had also been made for basketball.

No new coaches are being hired to replace Legs Binkley and Eddie Gabel, football and basketball mentors now in the service and on leave of absence, and the vacancies will be filled with material already available at the school.

Sylvester Kohr, who has been an assistant coach the past several years, will be head football coach and will be assisted by Harold Althoff and Harold Schahet who will work with the backs and reserves; William McConnell, who will be in charge of the junior high squad, and John Titsworth who will continue as trainer and also help with the junior high.

Althoff will be head basketball coach and while the court staff has not definitely been completed Titsworth and Kohr will undoubtedly assist him. No further arrangements have been made in regard to junior high basketball. Althoff will continue as track and cross-country coach.

To Enlarge Program

Despite the fact that the coaching staff has been depleted and no new men are being hired, the intramural sports program will be enlarged so as to affect more boys, Supt. Diener added. This is in keeping with the government's urging to "toughen up" as many youths as possible for future military and health reasons.

Last year some 150 junior high boys were out for football and it is hoped to increase this number while more stress will be placed on the intramural basketball program.

Nothing has been done in regard to a golf team for next fall, a sport also coached by Gabel, while it is hoped that the proposed recreation program here this summer will result in a revival of tennis and perhaps make possible a high school tennis team this fall and next spring, Supt. Diener said.
